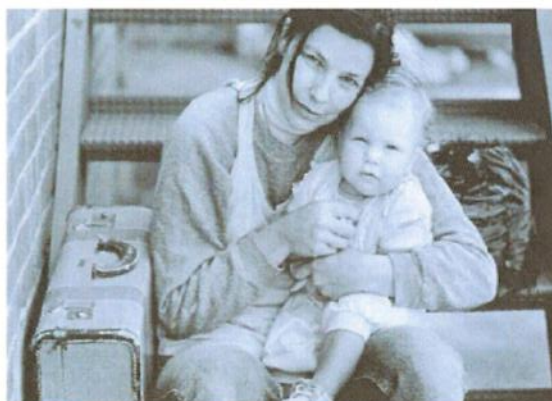
VOLUNTEERS

Tier One Partner Services

American GI Forum

The American GI Forum houses 110 Veterans and has expanded their operation with an additional 30 Single Resident Occupancy Units.

CentroMed

Centro-Med provides medical services to Campus Members and surrounding community.

Center for Health Care Services

CHCS provides services for substance abuse, addictive disorders and mental health needs. The Restoration Center provides Campus Members with triage, sobering, detoxification and outpatient services. CHCS operates Prospects Courtyard which serves 500 men and women.

SAMMinistries

SAMMinistries provides campus residential services with 940 beds for single men, single women, and families.

San Antonio Food Bank
